2020 was a year of reflection, reawakening, and resilience in which humanity was both united and divided as we grappled with the impacts of a changing climate, a global pandemic, and renewed public discourse regarding the tragic and pervasive impacts of systemic racism.

During the early months of 2020, it became clear that COVID-19 would have an impact in Manitoba. To reduce the risk of community spread of COVID-19, the Assiniboine Park Zoo and other Park attractions were closed on March 18. All programs, private gatherings, and community events were cancelled.

With precautions in place and reduced capacity, the Zoo re-opened on May 13, followed by the Park Café and other Park attractions. We enjoyed a good summer, with visitors welcoming the opportunity to visit our attractions and gather safely outdoors after a difficult spring.

Unfortunately, with a resurgence of COVID-19 cases in the fall, we were once again compelled to close the Zoo, Pavilion art galleries, and Park Café on November 12. This also meant the postponement of the return of Zoo Lights. The second closure lasted through the holiday season into the new year.

Despite these unprecedented challenges, we ended the year feeling optimistic about the opportunities that lie ahead and confident we could face any new challenges that may come our way.

As we reflect on the events of 2020, we wish to express our appreciation for our valued employees and volunteers who displayed courage, commitment, and compassion for their colleagues, our community, and the people we serve. We must also acknowledge the members of our volunteer Board of Directors for their unfaltering leadership and support. Thank you all for your unwavering dedication as caretakers, stewards and ambassadors for the Park and Zoo through these unprecedented and turbulent times.

Finally, we wish to extend our heartfelt gratitude to our loyal members, visitors, donors, and the community at large who stood with us through these challenges, showed tremendous generosity, and boosted our spirits with kind words of encouragement and support. Thank you!

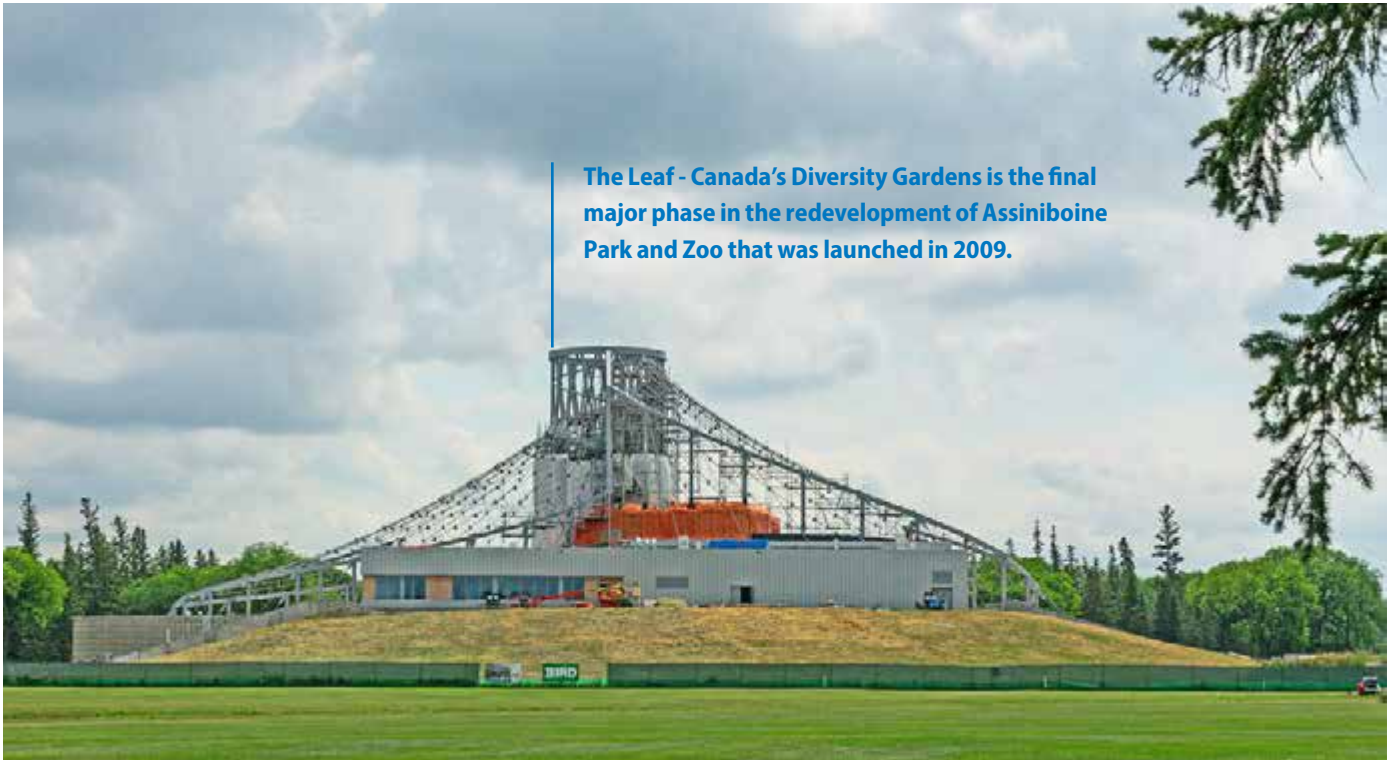

Founded in 2008, the Assiniboine Park Conservancy (APC) is governed by a Board of Directors comprised of community leaders whose affection for Assiniboine Park translates into a deep sense of responsibility to our stakeholders. They provide leadership, valuable guidance, and essential connections to the communities we serve. The Board of Directors includes representation from the City of Winnipeg as well as accomplished and respected leaders in our business, philanthropic, and post-secondary communities.



The Leaf - Canada's Diversity Gardens is the final major phase in the redevelopment of Assiniboine Park and Zoo that was launched in 2009.

Capital Development and Refurbishment

The Leaf – Canada’s Diversity Gardens

The transformation of the southeast corner of Assiniboine Park continued in 2020 at the future site of **The Leaf – Canada’s Diversity Gardens**. While the COVID-19 pandemic presented numerous challenges, significant progress was made on the building and the new outdoor gardens.

At The Leaf, construction focussed primarily on the part of the building that will house a restaurant and banquet, education, and support facilities. Crews also completed several critical steps in preparation for installation of the translucent ETFE membrane over the indoor plant biomes.

Over the summer, the **APC horticultural team planted 100 trees, 550 shrubs, and 12,600 perennials in the new outdoor Gardens at The Leaf** in preparation for their opening in summer 2021.

Zoo Improvements

In 2020, the **Zoo’s bison herd** was temporarily relocated to another area of the Zoo while significant improvements were made to their permanent habitat including landscaping, improved drainage, and new sand wallowing areas. Toward the end of the year, the bison returned to their rejuvenated habitat and work began on the construction of two new visitor viewing platforms and interpretive displays focussed on conservation, the historic importance of bison for Indigenous peoples, and the near extinction of the species. This project was made possible with generous support from The Winnipeg Foundation, Manitoba 150, and Build 150.

In September 2020, APC was thrilled to announce the return of **Aunt Sally’s Farm** to the Zoo. Construction began in early summer and continued into the fall in preparation for an opening in spring 2021. Inspired by the original attraction, which opened in 1959, the new Aunt

Sally’s Farm exhibit reflects modern standards for animal care and welfare and offers Zoo visitors a bright and joyful destination where they can learn and play.

Park Improvements

With events and gatherings cancelled, an opportunity was presented to undertake long overdue structural upgrades to **The Pavilion pergola**. Beginning in fall 2020, the entire pergola was carefully dismantled, including support columns and concrete. The APC team and contractor worked closely with the Department of Heritage to rebuild the beautiful structure.

In fall 2020, the **Riley Family Duck Pond** was drained so that a build-up of dead vegetation could be removed. This process will help improve water quality and the appearance of the duck pond. Work was completed in time for the pond to be refilled and ready for the winter skating season.

Zoo News

Animal Births

The following animals were born/hatched at the Zoo in 2020:

- a male **llama** named Earl Grey (May 12)
- a male **reindeer** named Jorgen (May 18)
- two male **snow leopard cubs** named Bodhi and Kyanada (July 1)
- a female **sunbittern** named Lady Macbeth *
- three **cinnamon teals**

Animal Acquisitions

A male **Japanese Serow** (Shimo) arrived in January from the Calgary Zoo. He can be found in the Grasslands & Boreal Forest section of the Zoo during the summer months.

In anticipation of the construction and opening of the new Aunt Sally's Farm, we welcomed three **llamas** – two females (Latte and Chai) and one male (Mortimer), two female **pot-bellied pigs** (Peanut and Penelope), and two additional **Nubian goats** (Carl and Alfie).

Female **Goeldi's monkey** (Shania) arrived in late 2020 from Zoo de Granby and was introduced to our male Goeldi's monkey (Johnny) in Toucan Ridge.*

A male **Patagonian mara** arrived in late 2020 from Riverview Park & Zoo and was successfully introduced to our females (Pixie and Dixie) in Toucan Ridge. He was given the name Mr. Dewey Jinks.

Summit, a male **Turkmenian markhor**, arrived in late 2020. Turkmenian markhor are a CITES I species, meaning their international trade is highly regulated. It took years of planning to complete this transfer.

Animal Departures

In late 2020, male **snow leopard** Akar was transferred to Safari Niagara and male **snow leopard** Kaash was transferred to Edmonton Valley Zoo.*

In late 2020, we also said farewell to Scotty the **Percheron horse**, who moved from the Zoo to a private farm in rural Manitoba.

NEW INITIATIVES, AWARDS AND RECOGNITION

Sensory Inclusion

In February, APC partnered with **KultureCity**, a US-based not for profit organization, to make the Zoo a certified sensory inclusive attraction and promote a more accommodating and positive experience for visitors with sensory issues. The initiative included training for all APC staff and free sensory bags – equipped with noise canceling headphones, fidget tools, and verbal cue cards – for Zoo visitors.

Creature Features

In March, with the Zoo closed and many people isolated at home, APC's communications team launched the incredibly popular live Creature Features series on Facebook. These engaging videos feature a range of Zoo animals and

special Q & A sessions with the Zoo's animal care and veterinary professionals.

Cargo Bar

In June, Cargo Bar opened a pop-up patio next to the Riley Family Duck Pond in the Park. The patio was open Wednesday to Sunday throughout the summer serving a variety of cocktails, wine, local beer, specialty coffees, non-alcoholic mocktails, and snacks. The new patio was so popular, its operation was extended into the fall.

Winnipeg Tourism Award of Distinction

In 2020, APC was recognized with the Winnipeg Tourism Award of Distinction for the 2019 **Zoo Lights Festival** marketing campaign, which

included a mix of paid advertising, paid and organic social media, on-site promotion, and earned media. The event attracted more than **86,000 visitors, with approximately 20% of tickets being purchased by people living outside of Winnipeg.**

CBC Manitoba's Future 40

In 2020, **APC Research Conservation Specialist Laura Burns** was named one of CBC Manitoba's Future 40 award winners! Laura was recognized for her work with local and international partners to save the Poweshiek skipperling butterfly, as well as her involvement with many other initiatives that aim to conserve wildlife.

FUNDRAISING HIGHLIGHTS

Australian Bushfire Campaign

In early 2020, the world watched in horror as devastating wildfires ravaged Australia. As an organization dedicated to animal care, wildlife conservation, and environmental education, **APC chose to donate \$10,000 from our Conservation Fund toward wildlife rescue, rehabilitation and recovery efforts in Australia**, and asked the community to match our donation. **An additional \$39,695 was raised**, bringing the total to \$49,695! 100% of funds raised were distributed to the **Zoos Victoria Bushfire Emergency Wildlife Fund** and **WWF-Canada** (on behalf of World Wildlife Fund Australia).

Animal Care Campaign

During the Zoo closures in spring and winter of 2020, APC donors demonstrated extraordinary

generosity in response to fundraising appeals in support of the daily care, veterinary services, enrichment, and nutrition for animals in our care. Special thanks to the **Kinsmen Club of Winnipeg who donated \$70,000** towards our Animal Care Fund at the end of 2020. This generous donation was in addition to over **\$30,000 raised for animal care through the Kinsmen Jackpot Bingo** in June 2020.

Garden Party

Traditionally held in the stunning Leo Mol Sculpture Garden, the annual Garden Party fundraiser was reimagined in 2020 in response to COVID-19 restrictions. On August 26, the 2020 Garden Party: A Celebration in your Home was enjoyed by over 350 guests from the comfort and safety of their homes. **Together with APC's inaugural Online Experience Auction, the event raised over \$170,000** in support of the care and maintenance of gardens in the Park and Zoo, as

well as plantings in the new outdoor Gardens at The Leaf.

Aunt Sally's Farm

In fall of 2020, APC announced the return of Aunt Sally's Farm to the Zoo. The new exhibit is part of a collection of projects designed for young children and families in the current phase of the ongoing redevelopment of the Zoo. APC was pleased to collectively recognize gifts from the following donors:

EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Virtual Programs

When in-person spring break camps were cancelled due to COVID-19, the Education and Programs team responded by adapting programming and camp to virtual experiences. In addition to a virtual spring break camp, the team continued to create videos and offer resources connected to school curriculums through the end of the school year. Funds from the **ParkShare program supported virtual programming and allowed APC to offer fully funded virtual programs to schools**, which was vital to educators while in-person field trips were not permitted.

Journeys Through the Zoo

In September and October, the Education and Programs team launched a new program called Journeys Through the Zoo, **in partnership with the Alzheimer Society of Manitoba.**

This program was developed to support the growing dementia friendly movement, which empowers community organizations to create opportunities that help individuals with dementia and their care partners participate and remain active in the community. In this four-week program, participants were invited to connect with our Arctic species and share memories of past travels, zoo visits, and other nature experiences.

Goodman School

In August, the Education and Programs team on-boarded its last cohort of teachers for the **Assiniboine Park Zoo Goodman School residency program**, which has given students in grades 4-6 opportunities to spend a full week immersed in interactive, discovery-based learning at the Zoo. The three-year pilot program was funded through a generous grant from **The Goodman Foundation**, allowing students to deepen their relationship with plants, animals, and nature. Despite the challenges presented by the pandemic, feedback from teachers and students was exceedingly favourable in 2020.

Twenty high school students enjoyed a trip of a lifetime to Churchill, Manitoba.



CONSERVATION, RESEARCH AND SUSTAINABILITY

Climate Change Action

In February, members of **APC's Education and Conservation and Research teams took 20 Manitoba high school students on a three-day trip to Churchill** where they learned how climate change is affecting the area. Before traveling to Churchill, they spent a day at the Zoo exploring strategies for overcoming barriers to climate change action, which they implemented on social media. This project was made possible in partnership with the **Churchill Northern Studies Centre and Polar Bears International and with funding from the Environment and Climate Change Canada Climate Action Fund.**

Poweshiek Skipperling Conservation

In 2020, the Conservation and Research team expanded their efforts to save the critically

endangered Poweshiek skipperling butterfly.

In addition to releasing 19 captive-reared Poweshiek skipperlings, for the first time ever, the team successfully bred the tiny butterflies on site at the Zoo. This has never been done before and is a critical development in the effort to save the species from extinction.

Arctic Research

In August, the Conservation and Research team travelled to Churchill, Manitoba to work on two exciting projects concerning Arctic species. The first project is an investigation of harbour seal diet and movement behaviour in the Churchill River area. The team also continued work on the Beluga Bits project, which engages citizen scientists in the identification of markings and classification of beluga whale populations in the Churchill River.

Bird Conservation

In an effort to maintain and increase the diversity of wild bird species in the Park and Zoo, the Conservation and Research team has endeavored to support natural areas that birds depend upon. Throughout the Park and Zoo, efforts have been made to mitigate window collisions and create new nesting areas such as an artificial chimney swift tower and tree swallow nest boxes.

New Bike Racks

Building on our commitment to support active and sustainable transportation, in summer 2020, four new permanent bike racks were installed in two locations on the East side of the Park near the sports fields at the Wellington Avenue entrance. A separate bike maintenance station, installed in 2017, is located along the pathway between the Lyric Theatre and Riley Family Duck Pond.

STAFF AND VOLUNTEER RESOURCES

COVID-19 Response

The COVID-19 pandemic presented numerous challenges for human resource management as APC worked to respond and adapt to frequently changing Manitoba Public Health orders and restrictions. Areas of focus included frequent email communication to all employees, technical and communication support to enable employees to work remotely, and enhanced health and safety protocols to reduce the risk of community and workplace spread of COVID-19. In November, in response to the potential co-circulation of COVID-19 and seasonal influenza, APC also hosted a flu inoculation clinic in the Park for APC employees, volunteers, and their family members.

Employee Training and Development

As part of our strategic priorities in 2020, APC developed and delivered Core Learning

Programs for all permanent employees focused on:

- COVID-19: returning to safe services
- Diversity and Inclusion: review of survey results and strategic initiative
- Orange Shirt Day: impact of residential schools

The key elements of the Core Learning modules were also consolidated and incorporated into APC's new employee orientation delivered to all new and returning seasonal employees.

Volunteers

Even though the Zoo was closed for approximately 15 weeks and all major events were cancelled, **volunteers donated close to 40,000 hours of service to the Park and Zoo.** They were essential to providing an exceptional guest experience while helping visitors and staff adapt to changing Manitoba Public Health orders and guidelines. Volunteers also helped with virtual events, painting, litter

picking, and many other tasks that supported daily operations.

Diversity and Inclusion

In summer 2020, APC launched a new strategic **Diversity and Inclusion initiative** that reflects the organization's commitment to making meaningful and lasting change at the operational level to:

- cultivate a culture of inclusivity that embraces diversity in all its forms including race, ethnicity, gender and sexual orientation;
- grow a workforce that reflects the wonderfully diverse community we serve; and
- nurture a sense of community within our Park that makes all feel welcome, accepted and comfortable to be themselves.

The initiative will focus on four key areas: hiring practices, employee training, marketing and communications, and programming.

Note 1

The Province of Manitoba has a \$30 million investment in the Leatherdale International Polar Bear Conservation Centre ("LIPBCC") and Polar Bear Facilities, which include the Gateway to the Arctic Building, the Animal Holding and Filtration System Building and the Polar Plunge. As a result, the Province's \$30 million investment in these capital assets do not appear on the Conservancy's balance sheet.

Note 2

The Conservancy has internally restricted funds for a fiscal stabilization reserve to support the long-term sustainability of the organization.

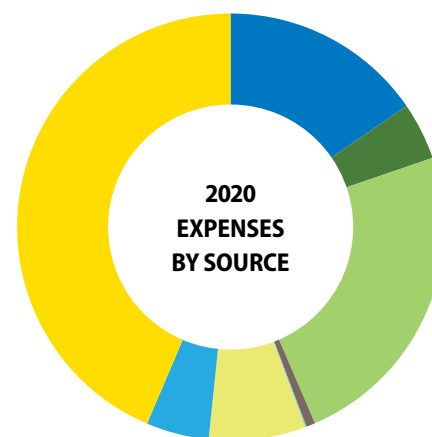
